Wife burning for failure to pay dowry as demanded also continues unabated all over India. It is a matter of great shock that such cases are increasing every year. The literacy rate of women is also lower than that of male persons almost all over India. According to 2011 the percentage of educated person increased to 70.04% of which male percentage was 82.14% and female percentage was 65.46% respectively. Bonded labour system a quite discouraging phenomenon hinders the girls and women education for unprivileged families of washer man and agricultural labour. Prevalence of dropouts among girls in rural, tribal and slums areas seems to be quite high. In India, the school environment for girls is not really interesting and encouraging. The methods of teaching are most outdated, rigid and uninterested. Schools with poor basic facilities as drinking water, toilet facilities, no good infrastructure and no experience teachers etc.

Though the status of today's women in India is high, the overall picture of women's position in India is not satisfactory.
